



After his bad luck in 2021, Jai Field lit up Super League in 2022 and became a Challenge Cup winner

Jai, born in Wollongong, New South Wales, can play at half back or full back and made 17 appearances in the NRL.

INoted for his dazzling feet, quick turn of pace and tricky ball skills, Jai began his career at St George Illawarra

After playing 11 games for St George Illawarra between 2017 and 2019, he joined Parramatta Eels in 2020 where he made six appearances.

Ahead of the 2021 campaign, Jai signed for Wigan on a two-year deal.

Jai made his debut for Wigan in the 2021 Round 1 win over Leigh Centurions, but it was cut short after he suffered a hamstring injury in the first half.

The half back returned from injury in August 2021 but suffered a further injury a few games later, this time on his groin and did not feature again in 2021.

Jai returned to the pitch in 2022 and was almost like a new signing for Wigan as he went on to make 30 appearances (the second most by any player in the team) and score 24 tries.

In April 2022, it was announced that Jai had signed a new two-year deal with the Club with an option of a third year - meaning the Aussie would remain in Cherry and White at least until the end of 2024.

In the Challenge Cup Final, Jai scored a second half try to contribute to his team's victory over Huddersfield Giants at the Tottenham Hotspur Stadium.

In an outstanding year for Jai, he was awarded Player of the Year and Players' Player of the Year at the annual Club Awards, he won Broadcast & Writers Association Player of the Year Award, as well as picking up numerous Player and Try of the Month Awards and was also shortlisted for the 2022 Man of Steel award.

Jai started 2023 as Full Back but was injured in the victory over Leigh in April, causing him to miss 7 games. On his return he was one of the best full backs in Super League and scored six tries in the last 5 games before the Grand Final. His try against Salford in September was one of the best tries of the season.

In January 2024 the Club were delighted to announce that Jai had signed a new two year deal with another two year option.

Abbas Miski is a Lebanese international who scored twenty nine tries in 26 games last season (Inc Challenge Cup).

Played his first game of the season away to Leigh Leopards in April.

His 29 tries included four hat tricks and his tally of five tries in the win over Castleford Tigers meant he had scored an incredible 17 tries in just seven games.

Abbas represented Lebanon at Under-18s level in 2013. He also played winger for his country in the 2017 World Cup and most recently the RLWC2021.

Also in 2019, he was called into Manly Warringah Sea Eagles' first team to make his debut. He also ended the year as the top try scorer for the Black Town Workers with 12 touchdowns.

Abbas signed for London Broncos for the 2021 season, where in 13 appearances, he scored 12 tries.

After an impressive 2021 season, Abbas joined Wigan ahead of the 2022 campaign on a three-year deal.

He scored his first try for the Club against Wakefield Trinity at the DW Stadium on Easter Monday 2022. Overall during his debut season, Miski made nine appearances and scored eight tries.

After being selected to represent Lebanon at RLWC2021, Abbas featured in all three of their group games, whilst also starting in their Quarter Final tie against Australia. He scored four tries in the tournament.

Adam signed for the Warriors in July 2023 from Catalans Dragons on a two year deal. In 2023 Adam played 24 times for Catalans scoring 13 tries and kicking 69 goals. His last game for Catalans was against Wigan in the Grand Final in October.

The 26-year-old, who has played at centre, stand-off and hooker began his career at Penrith Panthers playing in the New South Wales Cup where he was picked as one of two centres of the year, before making his first grade debut for the New Zealand Warriors in Round One of the 2019 season.

Having played for both the Giants and most recently Warrington Wolves on loan, the outside back scored 22 tries in 62 Super League appearances, before joining Wigan.

Halifax-born Wardle is an England international having made his try-scoring debut in a win over the Combined Nations All Stars in 2022.

He has also represented England Knights' on one occasion in a win over France in 2022.

One of the stand out players for Wigan Warriors in 2023, missing only one game and scoring 16 tries. His performance in the Grand Final win over Catalans Dragons earned him the Harry Sunderland Man of the Match Trophy.

Renowned for his acrobatic diving style and rapid speed when scoring tries, Liam Marshall made national headlines in 2022 and 2023 when he scored Wigan's Challenge Cup winning try in 2022 and then again with his Grand Final winning try in 2023.

Liam is a former Wigan Academy player who played for the Reserves side in 2016. He also played for Swinton Lions in the Championship in 2016, scoring 20 tries in 22 appearances. The winger was handed a professional contract with Wigan ahead of the 2017 season and he had a dream debut campaign, playing 24 times, scoring 23 tries and being named joint Wigan Warriors Young Player of the

He made his first major Final appearance in the 2017 Challenge Cup Final against Hull FC at Wembley Stadium.

After a number of stand-out performances, he signed a new four-year contract in April 2018 after a string of stand-out performances. Overall, in that year, he scored 16 tries in 21 games, but his season was cut short after picking up an ACL injury in August.

He returned to the side in 2019, becoming Wigan's Top Try Scorer for the season with 17 in 24 games.

After his ACL injury in 2020 Liam returned to action in June 2021 after a10-month spell on the sidelines.

In 2021, he made 16 appearances and scored seven tries.

In May 2022, Marshall made history as he scored the winning try in the Challenge Cup Final at Tottenham Hotspur Stadium against Huddersfield Giants - helping Wigan to win their 20th Challenge Cup.

During the season, he continued to prove his try scoring reputation as he scored 26 tries in all competitions.

In October 2022, Marshall made his England first team debut as he came off the bench in a 50-0 win over Fiji in a World Cup warm-up match.

Also in October 2022, Marshall announced he had signed a new three-year deal that would see the winger remain at his hometown at least until the end of 2025.

2023 saw Liam score 24 tries in 29 appearances including a hat-trick against Hull KR which helped Warriors to the Grand Final. Liam started the season with 8 tries in the first three games including 4 against Wakefield Trinity and 3 at Castleford Tigers. Liam also scored Wigan's only try in the Grand Final 10-2 win over Catalans

Renowned for his electric pace and dancing feet, Bevan French set a new Super League record in 2022 when he scored seven tries in a single game.

In 2023 he was one of only two ever-presents (Harry Smith was the other) and Bevan played in three positions during

the season, Full Back, Wing and Stand-Off. His incredible performances earned him the prestigious Man of Steel

Born in Tingha, New South Wales, Bevan is of Indigenous Australian descent and played his junior Rugby League for Tingha Tigers RLFC.

He is the nephew of former Australian international and St George Illawarra Dragons and Hull FC winger Nathan Blacklock

Bevan made 47 appearances for Parramatta Eels. Following his debut in May 2016 and scored 35 tries Overall. He also represented the Indigenous All Stars in 2017.

Bevan joined Wigan halfway through the 2019 season after being granted a release from Parramatta, he made his debut for Wigan as he came off the bench in the 36-18 win over Hull KR at the DW Stadium on 9th August and scored a try on his first start for the

Club a week later in the victory against Warrington Wolves.

Bevan became top try scorer for Wigan in the 2020 season, touching down 17 tries in 21 games in all competitions and was named in the 2020 Betfred Super League Dream Team at full back.

The Australian also helped Wigan to secure silverware in 2020, clinching the League Leaders' Shield following a win in the final regular season round over Huddersfield Giants. He was awarded

Players' Player of the Year and Player of the Year in the Club's End of Season Awards as well as the Rugby League Writers' and Broadcasters' Association Player of the Year for 2020 and shortlisted for the 2020 Steve Prescott Man of Steel.

Bevan suffered a season ending hamstring injury in May 2021 and returned home to Australia to complete rehabilitation. On his return in 2022, French was in fine form, scoring 31 tries and was crowned Top Try Scorer in Super League, winning his first Challenge Cup along the way.

During the 2022 season, Bevan set a new Super League record when he scored seven tries in a single match against Hull FC in July. The seven tries alone was a remarkable feat but when you consider he was replaced on the hour with a hamstring tweak, his seven tries in 60 minutes was amazing.

His fantastic work throughout 2022 saw him selected in the Super League Dream Team for a second time and shortlisted for the Steve Prescott Man of Steel.

After progressing through the Wigan Academy, Harry Smith has cemented himself as a fixture in the first team.

Harry was an ever present along with Bevan French in 2023 and was one of the best play makers in Super League.

In the 2022 Challenge Cup Final he created the assist to set up Liam Marshall's match-winning try.

A former St Judes ARLFC junior, Widnes-born Harry joined Wigan's Scholarship system as a 14-year-old from Halton Farnworth Hornets.

Harry's rise through the Academy saw him become Captain of the Under-19s, as well as a three time Grand Final winner (2017, 2018 and 2019) and the 2018 Under-19s Player of the

Harry was influential as he Captained England's Academy side to a 2-0 series win against Australia in December 2018.

In 2019, the half back joined Swinton Lions on loan in the Championship, as well as playing for Wigan's Under-19s.

He made his first team debut for Wigan in September 2019. coming off the bench and scoring a try in a 46-12 win over Catalans Dragons at the DW Stadium.

After a special season, Harry was rewarded internationally, with a call up to the England Knights squad for the first time and started in the halves in the 38-6 international fixture win over Jamaica in October 2019.

Harry impressed in his first full season in the first team in 2020, making 17 appearances, scoring four tries and kicking two drop goals. His injection of creativity throughout the campaign helped Wigan to their first League Leaders' Shield since 2012

2021 saw Harry's career go one step further, the Half back played in every game for Wigan, a total of 28. He went over for three tries and notched 32 goals in the season.

He played a vital role in the 2022 Challenge Cup Final. scoring a try in the first half, kicking 2/3 conversions and a grubber kick to assist Liam Marshall's winning try.

Named Young Player of the Year at the annual Club Awards, Smith made 24 appearances in 2022, scoring seven tries, 94 goals and two match-winning drop goals.

Smith made his senior England debut in October 2022 as he came off the bench in a World Cup warm up game against

In 2023 Harry put in several match winning performances and created some magical memories including a try in the Good Friday win over St Helens and a crucial drop goal at Warrington. His consistent performances didn't go unnoticed, and Harry was named, and played in the England team that beat Tonga 3-0 in the Autumn Internationals.

Ethan is a prop forward who was born in Sofia, Bulgaria before growing up in Wigan to later join the Club's Academy where he progressed to the first team.

Ethan was born in Sofia, the capital city of Bulgaria, where his parents were working at the time – his mother was a nurse and his father worked in telecommunications.

Born as Joseph Ethan Havard, his name is part of a family tradition, as his father is called Joseph Kieron Havard and his grandad is called Joseph Brian Havard.

When Ethan was six-months-old, his family moved back to England to live in Bath, before moving to Wigan a few years later – where his father, Kieron hails from.

Ethan first got into Rugby League at the age of five as his father was a coach at Wigan St Patricks ARLFC – Ethan started playing for the Under-7s team when he was six years-old.

After being approached by Wigan, Havard joined the Club's Scholarship system half-way through 2016.

He played the full second year in 2017 and was awarded The Riversiders (Wigan Warriors Supporters Club) Under-16s Player of the Year.

In 2018, he moved up to the Under-19s level in Wigan's Academy and played a part in the Grand Final winning squad that beat Leeds Rhinos 14-6 at the DW Stadium in September.

After stand-out performances in 2019, Ethan made his professional debut for the Club in the 46-16 win over Wakefield Trinity in July.

Ethan became a double Academy Grand Final winner when he started at prop in the 22-10 triumph over St Helens at the DW Stadium in September 2019.

In two years playing for the Under-19s, he made 42 appearances and scored 16 tries.

In 2020, Havard impressed in his debut season as a full professional, making 11 appearances before having his season cut short with an ankle injury. He picked up the first silverware of his career with Wigan's League Leaders' Shield success in November

Ethan excelled in 2021, making 25 appearances and scored his first try in Cherry and White against Warrington Wolves at the Magic Weekend in Newcastle.

In 2022, Ethan made 22 appearances, scored five tries and came off the bench in the Challenge Cup Final win over Huddersfield Giants.





His rise continued in 2012 as he became the Club's Performance Coach, a role that went alongside a new occupation as Head of Youth Performance in 2013, where he was in charge of overseeing the Club's Academy and Junior programmes, helping to produce players for the first team.

The Academy side enjoyed incredible success during his time at the helm, winning the Grand Final six times over a seven-season stint between 2013-2019.

During this period, Matt was also appointed as the England Academy Assistant Coach in 2014 – a role he remained in for three years, including the tour of Australia in 2016.

2018 saw a change of scenery for Matt, departing Wigan and crossing codes to join Sale Sharks as the Club's Head of Performance for a year before returning to the Warriors in 2019 as first team Assistant Coach, tasked primarily with coaching defence.

Following the departure of Adrian Lam at the end of 2021, Matt was appointed first team Head Coach and in his first season led Wigan to silverware - winning the Challenge Cup for the Club's record 20th time. He coached Wigan to a second placed finish in the Betfred Super League and a Play-Off Semi Final, as the Warriors scored 145 tries in the league in 2022.

At the end of 2022, Matt was named Coach of the Year at the annual Super League Awards.

2023 was even better for Matt and the Club. The team finished top of Super League and won the League Leaders Shield. After beating Hull KR in the play offs Wigan qualified for the Grand Final and beat Catalans 10-6 at Old Trafford.

Wigan also beat Leeds and Warrington in the Challenge Cup before losing to Hull KR by the Golden Point in the Semi-Final at Headingley.

HEAD OF YOUTH SHANE ECCLES

Wigan Warriors youth performance team is constantly growing and improving to create a stream of players progressing through the academy pathway and into the first team squad. In 2024 we will compete in the reserves, Academy & Scholarship programmes providing players with opportunity to develop their ability at the appropriate level with the aim of progressing into the next stage of their development. We have a recruitment team who are constantly watching players in the community game and assessing their rugby ability and their characteristics. Players are then recruited to join the club in one of our youth performance squads to provide them the opportunity to develop their skills and progress along the playing pathway.

For 2024 our scholarship programme is made up of 40 players in total.

We have 21 Under 15s and 19 under 16s players. These players are drawn from a variety of community clubs and schools where the coaches and teachers do a fantastic job in helping nurture the rugby league potential of the young players. The Scholarship squad is designed to enhance the skills and behaviours of the young players in preparation to make the step into the start of the professional game at academy rugby. The scholarship players started their programme in September with their first game being on Wednesday 20thMarch V St Helens @ Robin Park Arena

The academy squad is made up of 26 players with 13 Under 17s and 13 Under 18s players.

The Academy squad is the first level where our players are playing in a competition this is to help prepare them for the rigours of professional rugby league in a competitive environment. This stage of a player's development is where players can learn their trade as a rugby league player, not just on the rugby field but also how a professional rugby player behaves off the field and away from the club. We use a variety



of workshops to educate the players on how to be a professional rugby player.

The Academy pre-season started in November with their first game being on Saturday 16th March V Castleford Tigers @ Robin Park Arena

The final stage of our youth performance programme is the reserves squad, This squad is a combination of high performing Academy players who need a challenge to develop them, Part time reserves players who are with the club aiming to push into the first team squad and first team players who are not in the First team playing squad that week for various reasons. The reserves competition is a good opportunity for young players to be challenged against players that are further developed than them in preparation for making the step into the first team squad.



Having started their training sessions at Standish High School early in 2022, the team travelled to face Warrington Wolves in a pre season friendly for their first ever game on Sunday 20th February. Initially going 4-0 down, it was Jack Heggie who scored the first points for the new team and put his name in the record books. On the back of a hugely convincing performance, Wigan finished by scoring 100 points, with 5 tries apiece for Heggie and Dec Roberts, whilst conceding just 26.

That victory gave the team real confidence going into the new Wheelchair Super League, with fixtures



against London Roosters, Warrington Wolves, Halifax Panthers, Leeds Rhinos, North Wales Crusaders, and Hull FC to come. The schedule had all teams playing each other once, before a Top 4 and Bottom 3 split. Wigan finished phase 1 in second place, just a point behind Halifax Panthers, with a record of 4 wins, 1 draw, and 1 loss. After the split, it was Home and Away fixtures vs Halifax, Leeds, and London, but with 3 wins and 3 defeats, Wigan only finished third. This then led to a loss to Halifax in the play offs before the Panthers went on to beat Leeds Rhinos in the Grand Final.

Once the domestic season had come to a conclusion, the RLWC2021 was to follow, with numerous Warriors players earning international call ups.

Having played their part along the way, Adam and Dec finished the tournament with winners medals and some new found fame to take back to their club. At the start of 2023, due to having excellent numbers at training, the club decided to enter an A team into the Wheelchair Championship, meaning we were the first club to have two competitive teams within the divisional structure. This was the start of a what turned out to be a very commanding season for the club.

The first team started the season with a 59-45 victory over reigning champions Halifax Panthers, whilst the newly formed A team hit the road to take on North Wales Crusaders, ending in an encouraging 68-54 defeat.

For the first half of the season, the teams had contrasting results, the first team not being able to maintain their start, whilst the A team went from strength to strength with wins over Sheffield Eagles, Bradford Bulls, Rochdale Hornets, and Mersey Storm. This putting them second in the table, only NWC having a better start. The confidence that came from such a good start was the key to the progress within the team, as there was no predetermined end goal in their first season.

Whilst the A team form continued, the tide also turned for the Super League team. With only 2 wins from the opening 6 games, they went on to record 3 victories

in the remaining 4 games to seal a third place finish. With the exception of NWC, the Championship side went on to beat all comers and finished in the top 2. In the play offs, the A team defeated Sheffield Eagles to secure their place in the Grand Final at the first time of asking, whilst the Super League side had to make the long journey down to the capital to face London Roosters, a side that had beaten them twice in the league this season so far. Defeating the Roosters 43-34 was a huge shock, to everyone outside of the Wigan camp, but it now set up a double header for the teams in the Grand Finals on Sunday 15th October. On Grand Final day, the A team were first up and with NWC being the only team to have beaten them during the regular season, we knew it was going to be tough. but the confidence was high. A thrilling game saw the Warriors have the lead for the majority of the game, but a strong performance by the favourites after the break brought them right back into it and they took control late on. An 18 point deficit with 10 minutes to go was a mountain to climb, but one last push, led by Player/Coach Chris Greenhalgh, Nathan Roberts, and Mark Williams, the team were able to reduce that to just 4 points by the final whistle. Despite the defeat, to have had such a successful season, culminating in a narrow loss in the Grand Final, the A team were encouraged to be proud of their efforts and to use that as motivation going into next season. Looking to go one step further, the first team went into their final as underdogs, just as they had in the Semi Final, but the desire to achieve success was there for all to see. After an outstanding 60 minutes, it looked like the team were well on their way to glory. but Leeds Rhinos came back to not only challenge for the lead, but to hit the front with just 10 minutes left on the clock. Was this where Wigan faltered and it was going to be two GF defeats on the same day? It was a resounding no from those in Cherry & White, with Heggie, Roberts, and Martin Lane involved with the last two tries that turned Wigan into Champions. Having taken a newly formed team to the Grand Final in just two season could be considered a huge success, but to then field a second team and then take them to the GF in their first season was unprecedented. The coaches, players, and volunteers within the Wheelchair team are fully deserving of the praise heaped on them. The challenge now is repeating and improving on that success in 2024 and future seasons.
